## STUDY SHEET:

- 1. The dramatic story of Johnny Lee Clarey (Grand Dragon of the Klu Klux Klan) and how God brought him from hating all black people to a place of compassion in racial issues.
- 2. Only Jesus can change a heart (Ez. 11:19, Rom. 12:2, Ps. 72:4)
- 3. Racism is a sin against a holy God
- 4. The goal of this whole series is Christian friendship (Col. 3:11, Acts 13:1)
- 5. Multicultural needs to go all the way through to leadership in church
- 6. If you don't ever cross the line into deep, true friendships with people of other races, you'll make one of two mistakes: 1 be obsessed with the issue of race, or 2 deny the issue of race
- 7. Race is one of the top 5 factors in your deep friendships
- 8. It is the responsibility of the majority race to initiate relationship (Ex. 22:21, Ex. 23:9, Lev. 19:33,34)
- 9. Whenever you have greater power, that's a responsibility to serve
- 10. It's not easy for people of a majority race to understand what its like to be of a minority race
- 11. He is speaking to humble, Christian whites (Pr. 3:34, 1 Pet. 5:5, Jam. 4:6)
- 12. The Word of God has great life and we can enjoy this subject
- 13. The tools are humility and honor (Rom. 13:7)
- 14. Understanding how honor fits into friendship is the key, after humility, to having multicultural friendships
- 15. When your friend carries a burden you've never carried and carried it well, you give your friend honor
- 16. All Christians need to understand oppression
- 17. Satan, who is the author of all oppression, there are two groups he hates more than anyone else Jews and Christians
- 18. We, as Christians, will face oppression (Rev. 12:17)
- 19. When we learn what the Word of God says about oppression, we have things to apply to our walks with God
- 20. Black/White is a starting point (Mk. 11:22-24)
